PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Healthy Habits

a program that focuses on making choices that support a healthy eating pattern and physical wellness

81% of members stated they stop eating when they are full (up 3% from pre-assessment)

71% of members think about how their choices they make now can affect their health in the future (up 4% from pre-assessment)

SMART Moves: Emotional Wellness

a program that focuses on building the social-emotional skills of self-regulation, impulse control, and stress management

87% of members reported they care what happens to other people

(up 3% from pre-assessment)

85% of members show appreciation to others (up 1% from pre-assessment)
