(up 42% from pre-assessment)

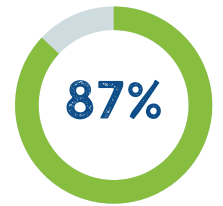
58% of members stated it is easy for them to choose healthy foods outside the Club

MEMBER IMPACT MOMENT: HARLEY

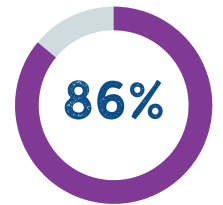

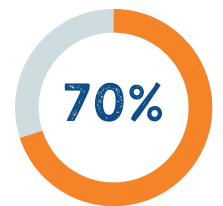
NATIONAL YOUTH OUTCOME INITIATIVES SURVEY



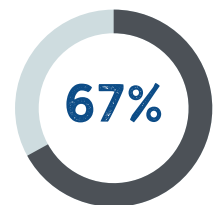
